

New Hope for Patients Suffering from Bladder Control Problems

Bladder control problems affect more than 34 million Americans. Women are twice as likely as men to have bladder control problems, yet most are too embarrassed to talk to their doctors about this common problem.

If you are suffering in silence, if you are not getting relief from prescription medications or if you haven't benefitted from surgery or other treatments for your bladder control problems, there is new hope in the form of a small battery like device. InterStim[®] Therapy, developed by Medtronic, is a stop-watch-sized device placed under your skin that uses neurostimulation to send signals to the nerves in your lower back that control bladder function.

In April, Dr. Pugach was invited by Medtronic to tour one of their production facilities and collaborate with their engineers on future ideas for new technologies to improve the treatment for overactive bladders.
